1. SKILLS FOR SUCCESS

The key Skills for Success in this career path are **Reading | Numeracy | Writing | Digital | Problem Solving | Communication | Collaboration | Adaptability | Creativity & Innovation**. These skills form the foundation for learning in different trades and technologies, playing a vital role in numerous occupations and everyday situations. A well-developed set of SFS ensures effective readiness for skill training and work, with a high standard required in many trade and technology fields

2. PURPOSE OF THE COMPETITION | SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

To enable the industry and observers to view the level of skills taught within the public, secondary programs, and to encourage interaction between the various sectors. This relationship will ensure the skills gained by young hairstylists at all levels of training are geared to the demands of the beauty industry. Hairstyling essential skills demonstrated by the competitor are Numeracy, Oral Communication, working with others, Continuous learning, Reading text, Writing, Thinking, Document use and Digital. These essential skills are used prior to and during the competition to execute the final project.

3. SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative ability in the following three tests:

- Test 1 SHORT HAIRCUT AND STYLE WITH PHOTO.
- Test 2 LONG HAIR UP WITH WISHES
- Test 3 FASHION HAIRCUT WITH WISHES & COLOUR

No written test will be administered. The theoretical knowledge will be relevant in the performance of the practical tests.

4. SAFETY

Safety is the top priority at the Provincial Skills Competition. All participants in the SCS Provincial Competition must meet the designated safety requirements for their respective event areas. These safety requirements will be thoroughly explained during the orientation with all the competitors. It is essential to adhere to these safety guidelines, as failure to do so will result in non-participation in the competition.

Safety Regulations Specific to the Hairstyling Competition

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Saskatchewan are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Saskatchewan and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.

- Electrical tools such as irons should never be in contact with flammable products.
- Electrical cords must be in good order and undamaged. They should never be in contact with or in the proximity of water.
- No tools exceeding 2400 watts will be permitted
- Competitors are not allowed to run in the skill area
- Mannequins cannot have coloured hair, sprays, or gels *See separate document: 29. PostSecondary -Test Project for exceptions
- Water spillage on the floor must be immediately cleaned to avoid accidents.
- Sweeping as necessary- depositing in the proper bin.
- Followed manufacturers instruction to properly disinfect tools
- Disposal of razor blades in Sharps containers
- Work area kept tidy, organized, and clean

6. EQUIPMENT

Committee will provide: Tools and equipment listed below will be provided to competitors at the competition site

- Table
- Chair
- Mirror
- 1 electrical outlet
- Mannequins for test 1-3 *All mannequins will be supplied the day of the event. They will have been competition prepped with Redken Shampoo & Conditioner and One United and will be blow dried and ready for the competitor. (Competitors if they choose can wet them down before competition with the spray bottle they have brought.)

Competitor will provide: Competitor is expected to bring the following in order to complete their competition

- Free standing tripod stand
- All tools and equipment in proper working order that is needed to do all 3 tests
- All styling products needed to do all 3 tests

- Their own working tools: spray bottle, towels, cape, cutting implements, combs, brushes, clips,
- Blow dryer max 2400 watts
- Must bring his/her preferred types of styling products
- Competitors cannot borrow supplies from others.
- Competitors must drape the mannequins during competition time
- Competitor must bring the SCS Supplied mannequin head, pre coloured as per Project Description

7. CLOTHING | UNIFORM | ATTIRE REQUIREMENTS | PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)

Competitor will provide

- Clean and comfortable work attire as would be worn by staff working in a modern hair salon as well as any protective clothing if needed.
- Apron
- Closed toed shoes
- Foot coverings (socks, sockettes)

8. PROJECT TO BE COMPLETED:

Test 1 SHORT HAIRCUT AND STYLE WITH PHOTO

Test 2 LONG HAIR UP WITH WISHES (additional marks for Instagram post)

Test 3 FASHION HAIRCUT WITH WISHES & COLOUR

9. JUDGING CRITERIA

- All judging will be performed according to the criteria. Quality of workmanship, Creativity, Suitability to the Test
- The competitor with the highest combined points from the three tests will be the winner, the second highest mark will be placed second, and the third highest will be third.
- Demerits may be given for any rule infractions.
- Post-Secondary and Secondary competitors will be judged separately.

Penalty Points

- NOTE: Any infraction not listed but in the contest description -1
- Any communication between the audience and competitor during competition times may be seen as coaching and could cause demerits to be awarded.
- Coaching –
 - First Warning -1 – 5 points
 - Second Warning DISQUALIFICATION
- Not having wishes -1 to -3
- Colour -2
- Use of Tools -2
- Out of Category
- Not stopping when time is called -2

Judges will be looking for competitors to follow all the rules and safety measures. This could include safety, accuracy, quality, appearance etc. marks could be deducted, for example, using extra materials, not having proper safety equipment, showing up late, etc.

10. TIE-BREAKING PROCESS

If there is a tie the person with the highest mark in Test 1 will be the winner. If there is a second tie the person with the highest mark in Test 3 will be the winner.
