Clyde Abanid, a student in the Graphic Communications program at Saskatchewan Polytechnic's Regina Campus, will be representing Canada at WorldSkills Lyon 2024 in Graphic Design Technology.

Earlier this year, Clyde received a silver medal at the Skills Canada Saskatchewan Provincial Competition (SCSPC) 2023 and gold at the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) 2023, where he guaranteed his spot on Team Canada 2024. Clyde and 28 other members will represent Canada in 28 skilled trade and technology competitions on a global stage next fall in Lyon, France.

"I first got introduced to Skills competitions by my instructors at Sask Polytech. The competition experience is amazing. You get to see other people your age with the same amount of passion, competing against each other. I remember feeling so happy when I realized I was going to be competing at the WorldSkills Competition. It's crazy to realize the heights you can reach by doing what you love. I feel my biggest challenge will be adapting to a different and bigger stage. Having to compete against people from all over the world makes me anxious, but overall, I'm excited to compete."

As Clyde trains for WorldSkills, he has had the opportunity to participate in numerous international practice competitions. These practice competitions allow him to put his skills to the test, mentally and physically. The projects are designed to be under tight time restraints, meaning competitors must make good design decisions while executing technical requirements to the highest industry standards. Skills has opened up so many opportunities for me and has gotten me places I never thought I'd be. I feel like I've grown so much as a person and it's given me so much more confidence. I've made so many memories and I couldn't be more grateful. I have improved so much in my trade as well with all the training I've done, and it has given me invaluable experience.




# PROGRAMING & STRATEGIC PLANNING

The Skills Fair on November 7th, held during National Skilled Trade and Technology Week, showcased **25 Try-A-Trade® and Technology activities curated by our partners and alumni where over 600 students were able to**  explore the many career options in the trade and technology sectors. The partner breakfast, attended by 100 participants from government, industry, education, labor unions, and alumni, was a testament to the collaborative spirit driving our initiatives.

# **TRADE & TECH DAYS**

#### A CLASSROOM REVOLUTION

Simultaneously, Trade & Tech Days brought hour-long presentations to entire high schools at a time. These sessions featured inspiring talks from our alumni and partners, accompanied by a myriad of Try-A-Trade<sup>®</sup> and Technology activities brought into schools by our dedicated partners. This immersive experience throughout the day opened the minds of students to the exciting possibilities in trades and technology.

Moreover, Trade & Tech Days extended their impact beyond our province's larger population centers. In Yorkton, SK, 700 students had the opportunity to experience the program and presentation, while in North Battleford, SK, 500 students were equally enthralled by the Trade & Tech Day initiative. Our final one for the year was held in St. Brieux, SK, where over 200 students from the surrounding rural area learned about trades careers in the local industry and beyond.

Our November and December programming reached an astounding 2100 students, offering them a firsthand experience in choosing to learn a trade or technology. We anticipate meaningful collaborations with schools as we move into the new year. We're excited about the prospect of schools reaching out to us about programming, fostering collaboration and creating an even brighter future for skills development in Saskatchewan.
